The latest crime statistics and Analysis look very encouraging. During October 34 crimes have been reported in Creekmoor and Waterloo area, which is a decrease from October last year, which recorded 38.

We are pleased to report a significant drop in Other Burglary and Theft from Motor Vehicle We have also seen a small drop in the number of Theft of Motor Vehicle showing a Zero for October 2009.

In relation to the one house Burglary the offender for this has been caught and dealt with.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you to be cautious of any suspicious activity by any individual in your area and please report to Police immediately. Please ensure you always lock and secure your house, Garden shed or Vehicle etc. Any valuable items left visible can be a temptation to others particularly in these difficult financial times.

If you are approached by any doorstep sellers offering services or products, be aware this could be opportunists using this method to earn extra money. If you have any concerns contact Dorset Police on 01202 222222

In relation to other thefts we have seen a further improvement from last years figures of 13 to a current level of 11. The recorded crimes relate to 6 shoplifting incidents, 2 stolen bikes and 3 miscellaneous thefts.

Some of these crimes may have been avoided had the necessary precautions been in place i.e. securing Bikes with chains etc.

We have however seen an increase locally in Criminal Damage incidents during October totalling 10 compared with 4 last year, this area remains a focus for all proactive patrols by Police response, SNT Officers and Specials.

We need to be vigilant and please request that any incidents be reported in order for an early response. Criminal damage increased last month 6 of which related to Vehicle Damage and 4 to Property.

The 2 Assaults have been detected and dealt with by way of charging individuals.

The "Other Crime" statistic has also seen an increase from 2 to 5. These have been investigated and include arrests, warnings, charging for Breach of ASBO and on going Investigation.

The Creekmoor and Waterloo Safer Neighbourhood Team priorities are:

- 2) Anti-Social Behaviour
- 3) Littering
